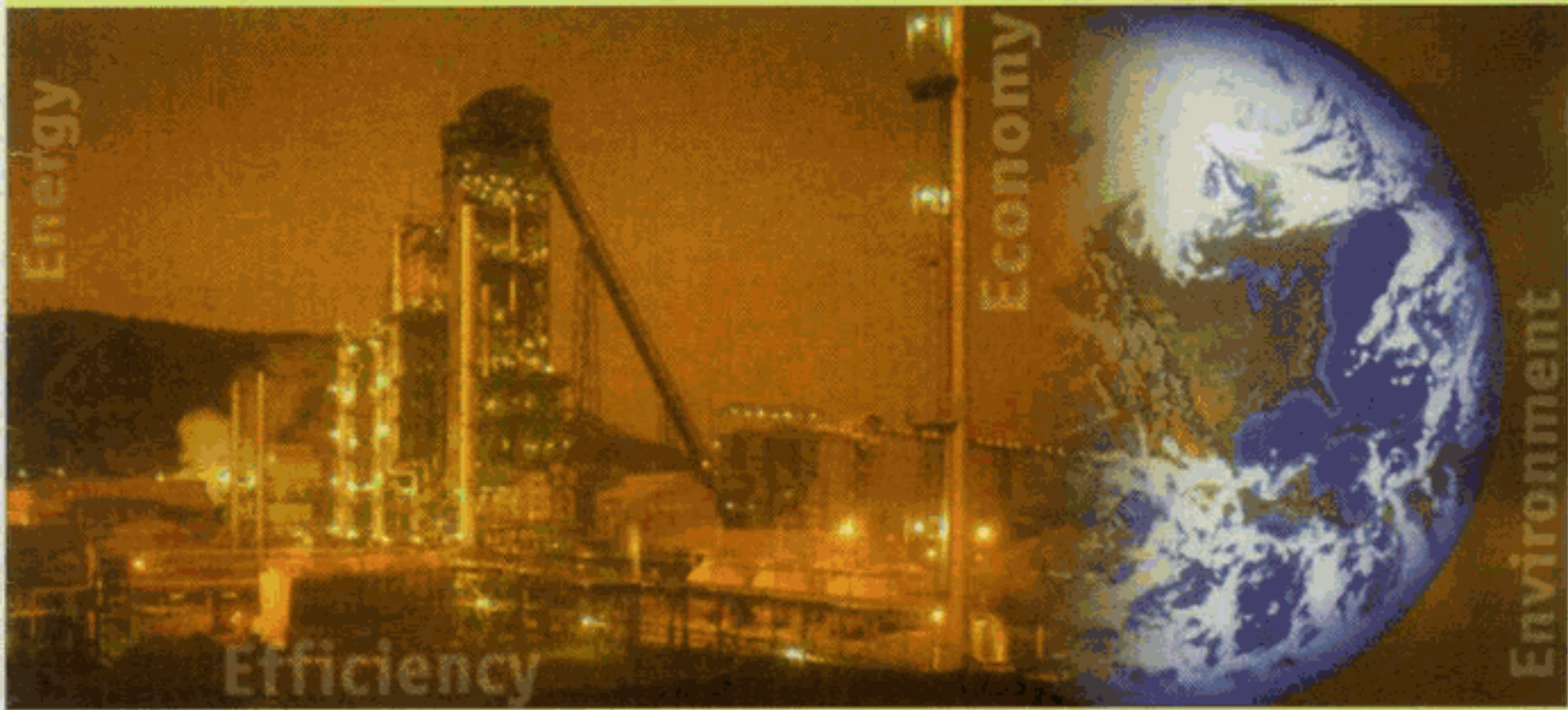

Energy Conservation

Energy Conservation has received attention in India since the mid 70s. The impact of energy conservation efforts are felt at a very low pace as the commercial energy consumption per capita is low in the country and efficient end use devices are costly. Recent rapid increase in energy demand, mainly in the industrial and the service sectors has created a renewed awareness about the economic advantage of energy conservation.

Structural changes in the economy has led to expansion of the industrial base in the country and subsequently the increase in demand for electricity generation sector has not expanded at a desirable level. This has also supported a renewed effort on energy conservation

INDUSTRIAL WASTE MANAGEMENT

Waste Management, apart from leading to pollution Control, resource conservation and energy efficiency results in better financial bottom line for companies. Wastes from industrial or municipal sources represent an increasingly important fuel source that can be used to produce heat or power. Companies can find a huge business opportunity in waste management, in areas of recycling, recovery, material and equipment supply, development of waste management sites, development of collection storage and transportation systems.
